Swimming in Key Stage 1 – Year 1

We are so fortunate to have a swimming pool in our school grounds. Throughout the summer term, children benefit from a weekly swimming lesson. By the time our children are in Year 6, they are already competent swimmers and can easily swim a distance greater than 25 metres as required by the National Curriculum. In most schools, children are only taught to swim for a maximum of 20 sessions in their entire school career and this would often take place in the local swimming pool at the end of a coach journey rather than after a short walk.

This year, we are fortunate that our Year 1 children will receive a swimming lesson each week, starting the week beginning 8th June 2026, until the end of the summer term. This will amount to 6 lessons in total.

We are also excited to announce that KS1 will take part in a mini swimming gala on Monday 20th July 2026. More details of timings will follow.

As you will understand, the cost of running and maintaining the school pool has increased significantly. The school receives no additional funding to support swimming for children, other than those in two year groups (as in other schools). All of the additional lessons our children receive are a bonus.

This year, we are asking for a payment of **£24.00** (£4 per lesson) for each pupil to cover the lessons for the term. I am sure you would agree this provides excellent value for money. Please can this be paid via SCOPAY [Login \(scopay.com\)](http://scopay.com) or as cash/cheque to the school office, in a labelled envelope with your child's name, class and amount enclosed.

Thank you to all those families who manage to contribute each year to the cost of these lessons. Each year, we do have some families who struggle to pay. Please do contact school in confidence if you need financial assistance or help to fund this. As many of you know, the future of our pool is always in the balance, so prompt payment is welcomed to secure its ongoing use for all children in school and our local community.

SWIMMING RULES

We feel it necessary to make clear rules with regard to swimming and would appreciate your support with them.

- All children to bring in a carrier bag suitable swimwear; girls must have a full swimming costume and boys must have suitable swimming shorts not below the knees (all clearly labelled). A towel, swim hat in their house colour, brush or comb, jumper, beach shoes or school pumps.
- On the sunny days please ensure your child has **waterproof** sun cream on. Please apply this before school.
- No jewellery. Please do not encourage your child to have their ears pierced during the summer term. Earrings can cause significant damage to children whilst taking part in sport. Plasters do not provide adequate protection therefore please remove earrings before coming to school or they will be asked to take them out before entering the pool.
- Long hair should be tied back and swimming caps (in their house colour) must be worn by all pupils. Please practice putting the swimming cap on with your child at home. These are available to buy from the school office for £3.00.
- There is no time for washing of hair following swimming so shampoo and talc are not necessary.
- At St Martin & St Mary C of E Primary School we encourage our pupils to become independent in their organisation, therefore **if they forget kit we are unable to ring home and they will be given a spare kit to wear if available.**

Year 1 children will swim on a **Monday afternoon** on the following dates;

- Monday 8th June 2026
- Monday 15th June 2026
- Monday 22nd June 2026
- Monday 29th June 2026
- Monday 6th July 2026
- Monday 13th July 2026
- Monday 20th July 2026 – Mini Swimming Gala am
